


With gratitude, we present to you the annual report for the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas.

This past year has been busy. We successfully completed a study with the help of CCS Fundraising Consultants. The study information and marketing roadmap presented by CCS provides us with a strong plan for our future growth.

With the support of Archbishop Naumann and the Board of the Catholic Foundation, we will add two staff members in the coming year. These additions will afford us the ability to be more intentional in our work with parishioners throughout the archdiocese. It will also allow us to work more closely with parishes, schools, and ministries in assisting them with securing additional funds for their endowments.

We are pleased to report that our assets now total over \$130 million. This is due to a bounce back in the investment market and to the addition of \$18.4 million in new deposits. Most importantly, we distributed over \$6.2 million to the parishes, schools, and ministries of the archdiocese.

We look forward to growing as a resource for the faithful throughout northeast Kansas. It is our mission to foster a culture of giving that will secure the future of all of our institutions.

We invite you to join us in giving thanks to our Lord for all the blessings He has bestowed on us.


9TH ANNUAL ARCHBISHOP'S

DEO GRATIAS AWARD - 2023 / DISTINGUISED CATHOLIC FAMILY

JOHN & CLAUDIA CATON

On Friday, September 8th, the feast day of the birth of the Virgin Mary, John Caton received a call from Bill Maloney, executive director of the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas, advising him that he and his family were going to be honored with the 2023 Distinguished Family Deo Gratias Award. "I was emotionally moved by this because I have personally known many of the previous recipients and know what great Catholic families they have been," John shared.

Growing up, John, his four siblings, and his mother lived in a small home on the parish grounds of Holy Trinity Parish in Lenexa, KS. John's father struggled with two major health issues, so he was unable to live with his family. Fr. Paul Miller, pastor of Holy Trinity, allowed John and his family to live in the house rent-free, and the parish helped pay for the utilities. On Christmas Eve in 1962, Fr. Miller called upon parishioners to help collect money for the family. John's mother, Mary Agnes, received a brown paper bag that contained \$650. "That was so much money to my mom that she put it under her mattress until she could get to the bank the day after Christmas. Fr. Miller and Holy Trinity Parish have been one of my family's greatest blessings."

Other than his brother, Bobby, who attended the Olathe School for the Deaf, John and his siblings went on to attend Bishop Miege High School. The four siblings cleaned the school's classrooms in lieu of paying tuition. John met his wife, Claudia, while attending Bishop Miege. The two were married on June 13, 1975 by Fr. Larry Albertson, and were members of St. Ann Catholic Church in Prairie Village for over 40 years. John and Claudia have three children: Megan, Molly, and David. All three are married, and they have six grandchildren and one step grandchild.


Msgr. Tom Culhane, pastor of St. Ann's, had a major impact on John and his family. Msgr. Tom requested that John take a trip to St. Francis Parish in Wichita, KS to spend a day with Fr. McCreed, who was known as the "stewardship priest" in the state of Kansas. John made the trip to Wichita, where Fr. McCreed and seven other

couples on the stewardship committee shared their ideas with him. John brought those ideas back to St. Ann's, where the parish then developed its own parish stewardship committee, planned giving committee, and established a parish endowment fund at the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas. John and Claudia have been heavily involved in their parish community ever since.

John credits several priests and Catholic individuals who have helped him and his family in numerous ways over the years spiritually, sacramentally, and financially. These individuals have impacted not only the Catons' faith life, but also their ability to give back to the Church. John was instrumental in opening two endowment funds for the Serra Club and assisted in the establishment of the Heart to Heart Scholarship Fund. "I want to thank the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas and Archbishop Joseph Naumann for helping us learn the value of giving back to our parishes, schools, and ministries of this great Catholic Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas," says John.









DEO GRATIAS AWARD - 2023 / DISTINGUISED CATHOLIC ORGANIZATION

MOST PURE HEART OF MARY CHURCH & SCHOOL

In August of 1946, Fr. John O'Connor was appointed pastor of the new Most Pure Heart of Mary parish. There were 136 families that moved from Holy Name parish to form the new church. Masses were first held in the basement of the St. Vincent's Orphanage that was run by the Sisters of Charity in Leavenworth. It is situated in the middle of the Most Pure Heart of Mary property.

Most Pure Heart of Mary Catholic School began with classes in the basement of St. Vincent's (now housing the parish offices). In 1950, the school was constructed with eight classrooms, restrooms, and small offices, along with the gym and gym basement.

Construction of the new church began in 1959, and on Easter 1961 (the year of Kansas' Centennial) the first Mass was celebrated in the new church building. The parish center was completed in 1982, adding two Christian formation offices, three meeting rooms of varying sizes, restrooms, an elevator, and four basement classrooms. In 1983, the orphanage closed and parts of the building were refurbished to house the parish offices and 6th-8th grade school students. The school and parish community continued to flourish with the implementation of the Krische Child Development Center in 1995 and major additions to the grade

school in 2003. In 2019, the development of the new parish rectory, which was fully funded by an endowed gift, was completed.

Furthermore, Most Pure Heart of Mary established an endowment fund in 1990 with the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas to provide financial support for the parish. The Most Pure Heart of Mary School Scholarship Fund was established in 2019 by combining six smaller funds, with the intent to make Catholic education more accessible to the community.

Today, Most Pure Heart of Mary holds eight endowment funds with the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas. These funds benefit not only the parish and the school, but also provide scholarships for 8th graders, assist funding for youth activities, supply materials for disabled students, and more. Teddy Reiser, Finance Administrator at Most Pure Heart of Mary Parish, shares, "By having these endowments and making our parishioners aware of them through our quarterly financial reports, we are able to sustain them through continued contributions and by the establishment of new endowments from parishioners' estates, wills, or even while they are still living."


The inaugural event for the Catholic Advisors Network was held on November 30, 2022, at the Polsinelli offices in Kansas City, Missouri. Dozens of both experienced and young professionals turned out to hear from a panel of advisors. The panel included Dan Hutchins, Kurtis Grothoff, Troy Kuhn, Emily Buckley, and Jon Stanfield. The panel, moderated by Casey Connealy, answered questions about planned giving, faith-based giving, how the current tax laws impact donors, donor-advised funds, and more.

Since the inaugural event, the Catholic Advisors Network has met at CrossFirst Bank with a presentation from Casey Connealy on the Secure Act 2.0 in April of 2023. On the first Friday of June 2023 was the annual St. Thomas More Continuing Education program, where advisors gathered for Mass with Archbishop Naumann and then participated in four one-hour continuing education sessions.

This past October Ryan P. Hellmer, SVP-Trust Officer at CoreFirst Bank and Trust presented to the Catholic Advisors Network – Topeka on the topic of Estate & Gift Planning Staples for Changing Times.

Our next Catholic Advisors Network event will be on December 5, 2023, at Country Club Bank. The presentation for the evening will be "Aligning Catholic Values with Client Financial Objectives".

JIM GILL'S INSPIRING JOURNEY

ESTABLISHING A LEGACY OF EDUCATION

Jim Gill was born at Fort Benning, Georgia, at the beginning of World War II. His mother was Catholic and his father was Protestant. He did not come to know his father until he was three years old, upon his return home from the war. As he grew up, his mother took him to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. He attended public schools, thus never receiving a Catholic education. As a college student, he drifted away from the Church and stopped attending Mass on a regular basis. After several years, Jim felt that there must be a deeper meaning to life, and found himself at St. John the Evangelist in Lawrence, Kansas. As a result of Vatican II, the Mass was conducted in a different manner than what Jim remembered growing up. He thought the changes of Vatican II were good for the people.

After Sunday Mass, one month following Jim's return to the Church, Father Al Rockers announced the establishment of a new parish in west Lawrence and introduced Father Frank Horvat. During the construction of the new church, now known as Corpus Christi, Mass was held in a Baptist church on Saturdays, and a junior high school auditorium on Sundays. Jim was not thrilled about the multiple locations, but his mother encouraged him to get involved in the new parish. The more Jim got to know Father Frank, the more his interest in getting involved in the parish grew.

Father Frank invited Jim to become a Eucharistic Minister, for which he felt honored to be selected, due to his mother being one of the first Eucharistic Ministers at Most Pure Heart of Mary in Topeka. He attended the training for Eucharistic Ministry and began serving at Mass regularly.

He has since moved to Olathe, Kansas, and often attends Prince of Peace Catholic Church and also Corpus Christi in Lawrence. Jim has taken advantage of the educational opportunities that Price of Peace offers. From all he has learned through these educational resources, Jim realized how much he has missed by not receiving a formal Catholic education, which was a driving force in his establishment of the James F. Gill Family Education Fund for his home parish, Corpus Christi.

Jim established the JFG Family Education Fund for Corpus Christi Church and School in December 2022, for the purpose of providing a financial opportunity for families of the parish with the greatest economic need. The fund would enable those families to send their children to Corpus Christi Catholic School. While updating his financial planning documents, Jim thought about Corpus Christi School, and how the teachers and staff provide quality education and a life plan in order for their students and families to live happily and reverently. He also had thought back many times about his own education growing up, and wished he had the opportunity to attend a Catholic school. Jim had an initial meeting with Father Jerry Volz, the current pastor of Corpus Christi, to determine if there was a need for a scholarship program and what an appropriate annual amount should be. He began working with his tax accountant to set up an education fund, but shortly realized that the process would be a major effort and expense. His tax accountant suggested that the Church would likely have a program in place to provide the services he was seeking. After minimal research, Jim discovered the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas, and contacted Jane Schmitt to learn more about establishing his fund with the Catholic Foundation. "Establishing the fund was very easy," says Jim. "The process began at the beginning of December, and my objective was to finalize establishment of the fund by the end of the year. With the help of the Catholic Foundation and Jane, I achieved this objective with no problem."

The JFG Family Educational Fund was established in such a manner as to remain solvent and provide opportunities to Corpus Christi students in perpetuity. The fund invests in the economy of the United States with both equity and fixed assets, and leverages those assets to benefit students, families and Corpus Christi well into the future. A fund of this nature provides support through changes in economic conditions, needs of the students, and growth of the church community. The fund is designed to provide annual student scholarships and financial support to the school for decades, and potentially centuries into the future, providing far greater benefits than the initial contribution. For example, an initial investment of \$150,000 will provide student(s) tuition each year over the next 100 years, plus periodic church bonuses totaling \$1.2 million. Of course, realizing this objective is dependent on the continued growth of the economy.

Through the JFG Family Educational Fund, Jim Gill has created the opportunity to provide financial support for families at Corpus Christi School well into the future. Though Catholic school was not an option for Jim growing up, he has ensured that many families with financial need at Corpus Christi, the parish that in many ways supported his return to the Catholic faith, will have that choice for their children. "I am a charter member of Corpus Christi Parish, and the church means the world to me and my belief in God and His teachings," Jim shares. The JFG Family Educational Fund will contribute to the continued growth of Catholicism in the Lawrence community by assisting students of economic need and support of the school.






